built in 1899

The deed to the present town hall was approved and put on record in 1899. In 1903 electric lights were installed. The town hall was used for the meetings of the Board of Trustees and for local and national elections.

In 1928, the boy scouts used the building for their weekly meetings. A library was once situated in the town hall in 1963 but was discontinued in 1966.

The Cherry Valley Beautiful committee placed a bell in the tower of the town hall in memory of the Charles Hyland family in 1966. The town hall was remodeled in 1970. The exterior also received white siding.

2003 to present Cherry Valley Historical Society

2001 -- Village Hall moved from the interurban building to the new Village Hall at the east end of State Street.
